The year 2017 marks the centenary of the Russian revolution - a formative event in the history of modernist art and architecture. It stands at the origins of contemporary political

and intellectual life. Visiting Moscow almost a century later, we will search for the origins of our own principles, beliefs and ideas, examining how conflicted political and social histories shaped the city's urban fabric.

We will visit iconic early-modernist buildings by Konstantin Melnikov, Ilya Golosov, and Le Corbuiser, among others, and learn about their past and present. Our program will also include other, well and little-known historic
